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
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Benefits of study in Germany 2025

- Pay the Tuition Fee: After receiving your offer letter, you'll need to transfer the required tuition fee to your university. Don't forget to keep the payment receipt, as you'll need to attach it to your visa application. The fee amount depends on the type of university you'll be studying at.
- Visa Application Documents: Next, gather all the documents you'll need for your visa application. These include your valid passport, the university acceptance letter, APS certificate, academic transcripts, proof of funds, language test certificate, and a motivation letter.
- Blocked Account: For students planning to study in Germany, you'll need to show that you can afford to live there. In 2025, this means you'll need around EUR 11,904 for one year. You'll deposit this amount into a special blocked account. Once you're in Germany, you can only withdraw a set amount each month, which ensures you have enough money to cover your living expenses during your stay.

Requirements for Public University in Germany

- The student should be Mature (19 years or above).
- Should have completed 12th Class, with an additional year of studying.
- Should have at least 80% or above.
- IELTS: Overall Band Score 6.0, not less than 5.5.

🗹 Postgraduate Program

- 4-year Bachelor's Degree Or 3-year Bachelor's
- Degree with 2-year Master's/1 year Diploma
- 75% or above in a previous qualification
- IELTS: Overall Band Score of 6.5, not less than 6.0.



Research or Doctorate

- Should have completed a 2-year Master's Program.
- 75% or above in Master's
- A student with work experience is preferred.
- IELTS: Overall Score of 6.5, not less than 6.0.

(Note: APS is mandatory for all)

Requirements for Private University in Germany

Private universities in Germany are independent institutions, often owned by private organizations, foundations, or companies. They focus on specialized programs, especially in areas like business, arts, media, and technology. What sets them apart is their smaller class sizes, personalized attention, and strong ties with industries, offering great networking and job opportunities. While they tend to have a bit higher tuition fees than public universities, they provide a flexible, career-focused education tailored to meet industry demands.

🗹 Undergraduate Program

- The student should be Mature (19 years or above).
- Should have completed 12th Class, with an additional year of studying.
- Should have at least 55% marks.
- IELTS: Overall Band Score 5.5, not less than 5.

🗹 Postgraduate Program

- 3-year Bachelor's Degree
- 55% or above in a previous qualification
- IELTS: Overall Band Score of 6.0, not less than 5.5.

Research or Doctorate

- Should have completed a 2-year Master's Program.
- 70% or above in Master's
- A student with work experience is preferred.
- IELTS: Overall Score of 6.5, not less than 6.0.
